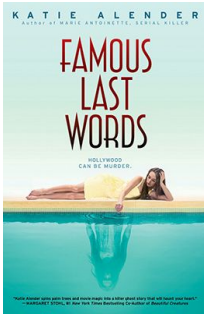

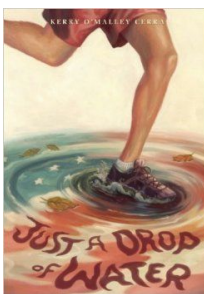
Famous Last Words by Katie Alender

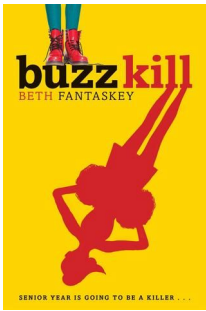
Midnight Thief by Livia Blackburne

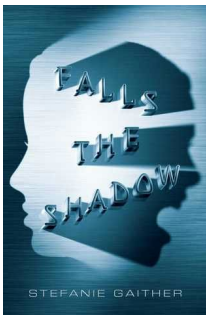
Just A Drop of Water by Kerry O'Malley Cerra

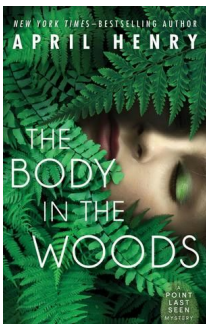
Buzz Kill by Beth Fantaskey

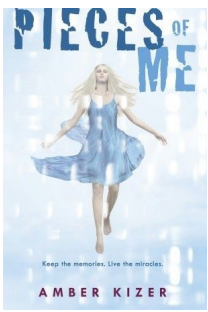
Falls The Shadow by Stefanie Gaither

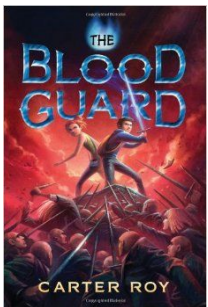
***Pieces of Me* by Amber Kizer**

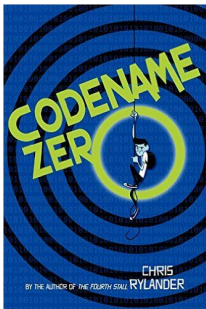
***Grandmaster* by David Klass**

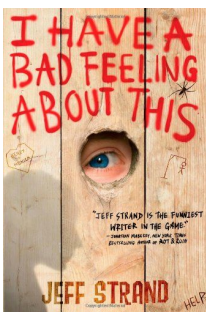
***The Blood Guard* by Carter Roy**

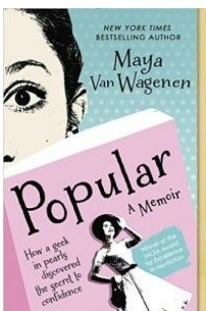
Codename Zero by Chris Rylander

After two weeks of mostly inept participation, the boys spend their final day competing in the Survival Games Challenge to test their training. Then three armed men arrive at the camp to kill Max for money they say he owes, and suddenly the pretend games have become very, very real as Henry and his fellow campers use their new skills to survive.
